SERIOUS FUN FOR CHILDREN

In Yangon, Myanmar (Rangoon, Burma) disadvantaged children are learning juggling and circus skills with Serious Fun volunteers. Juggling develops reflexes, coordination, concentration, cooperation, confidence and self esteem - but most of all, it is fun.

These kids have not had much fun in their short lives. They are orphans, street children, kids who have fled conflict zones and working children helping their families to survive.

These young jugglers will join visiting performers in free shows for their communities and the public during the International Juggling Festival 9-15 February 2015, organised by Serious Fun in partnership with local NGO Smile Education & Development Foundation.

European juggling companies have donated equipment for the kids and our juggling specialist Mr Jules is teaching them how to be teachers themselves so they'll be able to keep juggling and pass on their skills to more children long after the festival is over.

A juggling festival is a lot of fun but we also have a serious mission to bring people together, bridge gaps and share skills. The Mayor's office has approved our key event, a Day of Fun in Mahabandoola Park on February 14, where the juggling kids, international jugglers and community groups will join us to create a day of entertainment and fun.

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We also have a joint youth development project with the Yangon Photography Festival at Institute Francais de Birmanie (IFB) involving 30 teenagers including former child soldiers. This group is learning juggling, photography, performance, life skills and leadership skills, culminating in a very special performance at IFB on February 13.

A Training of Trainers programme has been planned with Eden Centre for Disabled Children and Shwe Minn Tha Foundation, led by adaptive circus specialist Thomas Hinz.
